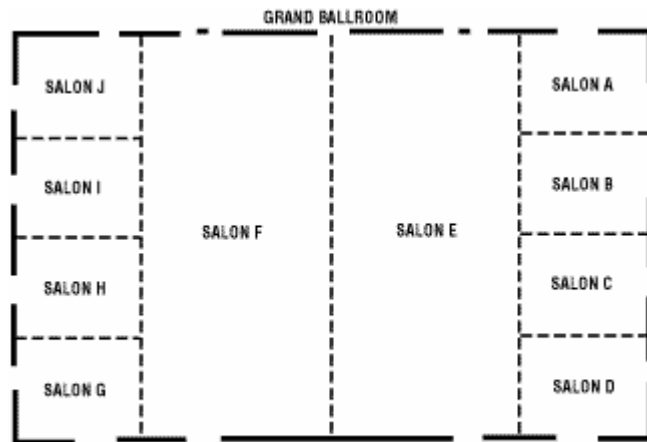
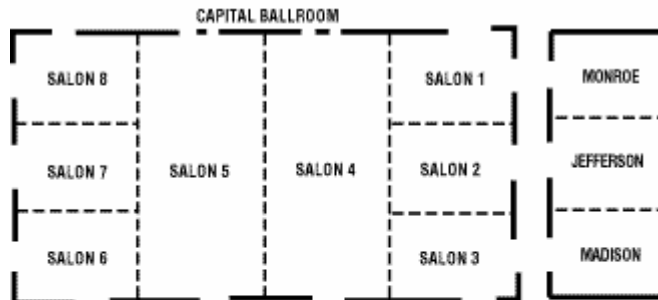


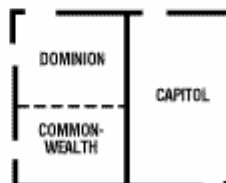

### **SUGGESTED ATTIRE**

**Meetings:** *Women:* Business casual –skirts, dresses; coordinated pant or Capri suits, **no jeans or, t-shirts**. Polo shirts with appropriate Jobie logos are approved.

*Men:* Slacks and sports shirt

**Supreme Bethel Meeting:** skirts or dresses

**Sales and Registration Areas:** Nice sports or casual wear.
